The children we serve are unique and require personalized and tailored support to reach their full potential. Regardless of the challenges which bring them to our Northfield campus, one consistent theme for each of these kids is the need to feel accepted. Of course, we create this welcoming community on campus through our programs and services, but these kids yearn to feel a sense of belonging in the world beyond Spaulding. As a component of their therapeutic process, this community building is a critical step towards preparing for their life beyond Spaulding.



Throughout the year, Spaulding staff dedicate hundreds of hours toward identifying and planning near-daily off-campus excursions for our children. Some of these off-campus trips are for everyday activities we take for

granted, such as grocery shopping, haircuts, dining or the car wash. Other trips are designed to build childhood memories, such as visits to the park, beach, movie theater, sporting events, arcades or comic book store.

Beyond these excursions, our students have also shined brightly by participating in local community events. In the spring, a group of students tested their culinary skills by creating a signature dish to serve at the Northfield Pines Mac and Cheese Competition. After earning the Peoples' Choice award last year, Spaulding Youth Center won 2nd place in 2019. The kids were so proud of their creation and accomplishment!

Another favorite community event for our kids is the Tilton-Northfield Home Day parade. Last year, our Flower Power float and tie dye shirts earned the kids lots of positive attention while providing a great




opportunity for them to celebrate their community with neighbors and friends. We are excited to unveil this year's top-secret float design on June 29th!
